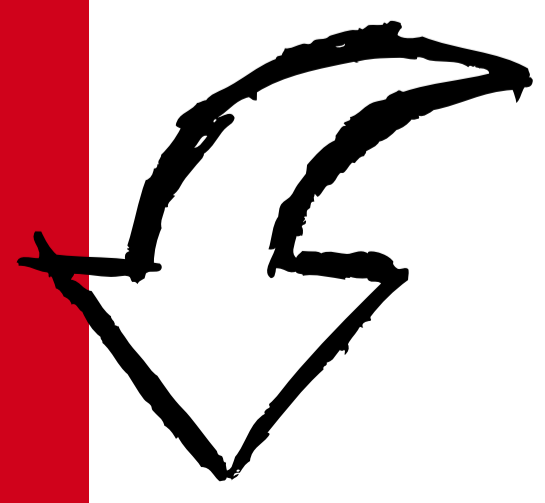

## RHO Attendance

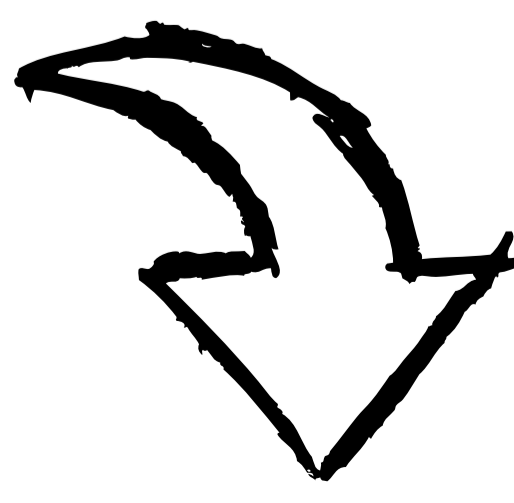
- Fully online student's attendance is based on weekly communication. If students fail to respond to the teacher's communication attempts, the student will be considered absent for that week (per state attendance guidance).
- Students who do not meet the communication progress expectations:
  - After 1 week, the student will be put on probation
  - After 2 weeks, will remain on probation and be referred to the principal. Attendance contract will be put in place
  - After 3 weeks: The student's Graduation Alliance account will be paused, mandatory meeting with the principal, student, and parent. The attendance contract will be revisited
  - After 4 weeks: Students will be unenrolled

## Message from Food Service

- Food Service is available for CSPS students learning virtually. We offer meal pickup from 12:30-1:30 every day in the lower parking lot of the District Office. Students can receive breakfast and lunch at the same time.

# Academic Expectations

Online courses offer many benefits for students and families. However, some students also experience difficulties in managing their own learning, pace, and academic expectations. In looking at the first 2 weeks of data, we are noticing that some students are spending time in courses, but are not yet demonstrating the necessary proficiency or mastery of content. In collaboration with Graduation Alliance, the following expectations are in place to help the student achieve the level of understanding and mastery of content necessary to receive credit for a course.

**1. A student must complete EVERY assignment in order to be eligible to take the exam and earn credit for the course.**

**2. Don't automatically start at the "Next" assignment if there were assignments you missed. Those MUST be completed first. No Zeros!**

**3. A student must earn a 60% or better on every assignment\* in order to be eligible to take the exam and earn credit for the course. Most assignments may be redone to achieve a 60% or better demonstration of understanding.**

**4. Final grade calculation:  
90% Class Grade  
10% Final Exam**

\*a few assignments are unable to be redone, for these assignments, a best-effort must have been evident. Contact the course teacher to request to redo an assignment if the option is not present within the assignment itself.
